Important Warranty Information Regarding Television Format Viewing

Standard screen format televisions (4:3, the aspect ratio of the screen width to height) are primarily designed to view standard format full-motion video. The images displayed on them should primarily be in the standard 4:3 ratio format and constantly moving. Displaying stationary graphics and images on screen, such as the dark top and bottom letterbox bars (wide screen pictures), should be limited to no more than 15% of the total television viewing per week.

Wide screen format televisions (16:9, the aspect ratio of the screen width to height) are primarily designed to view wide screen format full-motion video. The images displayed on them should primarily be in the wide screen 16:9 ratio format, or expanded to fill the screen if your model offers this feature, and constantly moving. Displaying stationary graphics and images on screen, such as the dark side-bars on non-expanded standard format television video and programming, should be limited to no more than 15% of the total television viewing per week.

Additionally, viewing other stationary images and text such as stock market reports, video game displays, station logos, web sites or computer graphics and patterns, should be limited as described above for all televisions. Displaying any stationary images that exceed the above guidelines can cause uneven aging of picture tubes (CRTs) that leave subtle, but permanent burned-in ghost images in the television picture. To avoid this, vary the programming and images, and primarily display full screen moving images, not stationary patterns or dark bars. On television models that offer picture sizing features, use these controls to view the different formats as a full screen picture.

Be careful in the selection and duration of television formats used for viewing. Uneven CRT aging as a result of format selection and use, as well as other burned-in images, is not covered by your Samsung limited warranty.

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




Rear of the TV





Inserting the Batteries in the Remote Control








You must insert or replace the batteries in the remote control when you:


- ◆ Purchase the television
- ♦ Find that the remote control is no longer operating correctly
- 1 Remove the cover on the rear of the remote control by pressing the symbol (♥) downwards and then pulling firmly to remove it.
- Insert two R03, UM4, "AAA" 1.5V or equivalent batteries taking care to respect the polarities:
 - + on the battery against + on the remote control
 - on the battery against on the remote control
- 3 Replace the cover by aligning it with the base of the remote control and pressing it back into place.
 - Do not mix battery types, i.e. alkaline and manganese.

Infrared Remote Control



The performance of the remote control may be affected by bright light.

Connecting to an Aerial or Cable Television Network



To view television channels correctly, a signal must be received by the set from one of the following sources:

- An outdoor aerial
- A cable television network
- A satellite network
- 1 In the first three cases, connect the aerial or network input cable to the ANT IN on the rear of the television.
- 2 If you are using an indoor aerial, you may need to adjust it when tuning your television until you obtain a picture that is both sharp and clear.

Connecting a Satellite Receiver or Decoder

In order to watch television programmes broadcast via a satellite network, you must connect a satellite receiver to the rear of TV. Also, in order to descramble a coded transmission signal, you must connect a decoder to the rear of TV.

♦ Using a SCART cable


Connect the receiver (or decoder) SCART cable to one of the SCART connectors on the rear of the television.

♦ Using a coaxial cable


Connect a coaxial cable to the:

- Receiver (or Decoder) output socket.
- Television aerial input socket.
- If you wish to connect both a satellite receiver (or decoder) and a VCR, you should connect the:
 - ◆ Receiver (or Decoder) to the VCR
 - ♦ VCR to the television

Otherwise, connect the receiver (or decoder) directly to the television.



Switching Your Television On and Off




The mains lead is attached to the rear of your television.

- 1 Plug the mains lead into an appropriate socket.
 - The main voltage is indicated on the rear of the television and the frequency is 50 or 60Hz.
- Press the "I" button (On/Off) on the front or side of the television.
 Result: The Standby indicator on the front of the television lights up.
- 3 Press the **POWER** (((a)) button on the remote control to switch the television on.

Result: The programme that you were watching last is reselected automatically.

- If you have not yet stored any channels, No clear picture appears. Refer to "Storing Channels Automatically" on page 42 or "Storing Channels Manually" on page 44.
- You can also switch the television back on by pressing the P ○/○ (or ^ C/P.(¹) ∨ on the front panel) or numeric button on the remote control.
- 4 To switch your television off, press the "I" button (On/Off) again.

Placing Your Television in Standby Mode



Your television can be placed in Standby mode, in order to reduce the power consumption.

Standby mode can be useful when you wish to interrupt viewing temporarily (during a meal, for example).

- 1 Press the **POWER** ((())) button on the remote control.

 Result: The screen is turned off and the Standby indicator on the front of the television lights up in red.
- To switch the television back on, simply press the POWER ((()) button again.
 - You can also switch on by pressing the TV/DTV or P @/@button.
 - You can also switch the television back on by pressing the P ⊘/⊘ (or ^ C/P.(¹) ✓ on the front panel) or numeric button on the remote control.
 - Do not leave your television in Standby mode for long periods of time (when you are away on holiday, for example). Turn your television off by pressing the "1" button (On/Off) on the front or side of the television. It is best to unplug the set from the mains and aerial.


Becoming Familiar with the Remote Control

The remote control is used mainly to:

- ♦ Change channels and adjust the volume
- ♦ Set up the television using the on-screen menu system

Plug and Play Feature













When the television is initially powered on, three basic customer settings proceed automatically and subsequently: setting the language, channel and clock.

1 If the television is in Standby mode, press the **POWER** (((())) button on the remote control.



The message Start Plug & Play is displayed.

2 To start the Plug & Play, press the **ENTER** () button.

> The options available in the **Setup** group are displayed with **Language** is selected.

3 Select the appropriate language by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button. Press the **ENTER** () button.

Result: The message Check antenna input. is displayed.

4 Make sure that the antenna is connected to the TV. Press the **ENTER** () button.

> Result: The Auto Store menu is displayed with Country is selected.

5 Select your country by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button. Press the **ENTER** () button.

> Result: The **Search** menu is displayed.

6 To start the channel store, press the **ENTER** () button.

> The search will end automatically. Channels are sorted and stored in an order which reflects their position in the frequency range (with lowest first and highest last). When it has finished, the Clock menu is displayed.

> To stop the search before it has finished or return to normal viewing, press the **MENU** () button.

7 Press the ◀ or ▶ button to move to the Hour or Minute. Set these by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button.

You can also set the Hour and Min by pressing the numeric buttons directly.

Plug and Play Feature (continued)

8 When you have finished, press the **MENU** () button.

Result: The menu is turned to **Auto Store** in DTV mode automatically.

If you want to reset this feature...

1 Press the MENU () button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select **Setup**.

Result: The options available in the **Setup** group are displayed.

- 3 Press the ENTER () button.



Changing Channels



It may take some time to display a channel if your chosen channel has the MHEG feature.

Using the P <a>/ buttons.

Press the P @/ @ button on the remote control ($C/P. \lor V$ on the front of TV).

The TV changes channels in sequence. You can select all channels (analog and digital channels) that the TV has memorized.

You can not select channels that were either erased or not memorized.

Using the numeric (0~9) buttons.

Press the numeric buttons to quickly tune to any channel.

You can select all channels that were either erased or not memorized.

To select analog channel **27**, press the ——, **2**, then **7**. To select digital channel **27**, press the **0**, **2**, then **7**. The TV will change channels when you press the second number.

To change to single-digit channels (0~9) faster, press the $\mathbf{0}$ before the single digit. (For analog channel $\mathbf{4}$, press the $\mathbf{0}$, then $\mathbf{4}$. For digital channel $\mathbf{4}$, press the $\mathbf{0}$, $\mathbf{0}$, then $\mathbf{4}$.)


➤ MHEG (Multimedia and Hypermedia Information Coding Experts Group)?

An International standard for data encoding systems used in multimedia and hypermedia. This is at a higher level than the MPEG system which includes data-linking hypermedia such as still images, character service, animation, graphic and video files as well as multimedia data. MHEG is user runtime interaction technology and is being applied to various fields including VOD (Video-On-Demand), ITV (Interactive TV), EC (Electronic Commerce), tele-education, tele-conferencing, digital libraries and network games.

Displaying Information

You can view the channel information and setting status you select by pressing the "INFO (□)" button on the remote control.






Adjusting the Screen Automatically (Self Focus)









The "Self Focus" feature automatically finds the optimum picture quality when blurring, overlapping colours or incorrect focus occurs. These conditions may be caused by moving your TV.

1 Press the MENU () button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select **Setup**.

Result: The options available in the **Setup** group are displayed.

- 3 Press the ENTER (→) button.
- Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Self Focus. Press the ENTER (→) button.

Result: The **Self Focus** is selected.

5 Press the ENTER (→) button again

Result:

The self focus process begins with the message **Self Focus** and horizontal bar is displayed. During the process, minor distortions of the picture may occur. At this time, the colors may diffuse and a searching action will appear on the edges of the screen. This is a normal part of the adjustment. When it is finished, all of things will disappear and the optimum picture quality can be enjoyed.

- It can be displayed simply by pressing the SELF FOCUS button.
- Changing channels and any other signal changes will pause the self focus until a stable signal has returned. It resumes after the signal has been stabilised. This feature will not work without a signal.
 - ◆ Ambient light that is too bright may affect the self focus. If this occurs, darken the environment and try again.

Deactivating the Automatic Execution of the Self Focus

The "Self Focus" feature starts on default. It will automatically begin 10 minutes after switching on the power and the appearance of the screen image. To set the optimum picture quality, the "Self Focus" will automatically begin again after another 30 minutes, as the screen image is then fully stabilised.

Press the MENU (□□) button.
 Result: The main menu is displayed.
 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Setup.
 Result: The options available in the Setup group are displayed.
 Press the ENTER (□□) button
 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Self Focus. Press the ENTER (□□) button.
 Result: The options available in the Self Focus group are displayed.

6 To turn off the automatic execution of the self focus feature, select off by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button. Press the ENTER (→) button.





Updating the Channel List Automatically





You can update the channel list when the broadcaster adds new services or if you move the TV to a new location.

1 Press the **D.MENU** button.

Result: The DTV menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select **Channel**.

Result: The options available in the **Channel** group are displayed.

3 Press the ENTER (→) button.

Result: The Auto Store is selected.

4 Press the **ENTER** () button again to start the search.

Result: When it has finished, the number of scanned services will be displayed.

- The existing favourite channel list will be deleted when the channel list is updated.
 - ◆ To stop the scan before it has finished, press the ENTER (→) or D.MENU button.
- If the signal status is poor, the **No service found! Check the aerial connection** message is displayed.

Updating the Channel List Manually

You can specify the channel or frequency for a fast channel search.

1 Press the **D.MENU** button.

Result: The DTV menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Channel.

Result: The options available in the Channel group are

displayed.

3 Press the ENTER (→) button.

4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Manual Store.

5 Press the **ENTER** () button.

Result: The options available in the Manual Store group are

displayed.

6 Press the ◀ or ▶ button to select Channel, Frequency, or Bandwidth.

♦ Channel

Press the \blacktriangle , \blacktriangledown or numeric buttons (0~9) to select a channel. The available channels are 21~68.

Result: The corresponding frequency for the selected

channel is automatically set.

♦ Frequency

You can specify the frequency (KHz) using the numeric buttons (0~9). If you do not know the exact frequency, follow the above step to select the frequency automatically using channel.

♦ Bandwidth

Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select a bandwidth. The available bandwidths are 7 and 8 MHz.

In England, 8MHz bandwidth is provided by default.


7 Press the red button to start the scan for digital services.

Result: When it has finished, channels are updated in the

channel list.













Editing Your Favourite Channels













In the case of DTV mode, **OK** or **Select** can be used as the **ENTER** () button.

You can edit your favourite channels using the colour buttons. Before setting your favourite channels, run Auto Store first.

1 Press the **D.MENU** button.

Result: The DTV menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Channel.

Result: The options available in the **Channe1** group are displayed.

- 3 Press the ENTER (←) button.
- 4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Favourite Channels.
- 5 Press the ENTER () button.

 Result: The Favourite Channels menu is displayed.
- **6** Press the red button to display all currently stored channels.
- 7 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select a channel you want. Press the ENTER (→) button.

Result: A "★" icon is shown next to the selected channel and the channel will be added to the favourites list.

- To undo, press the ENTER () button again.
 - ◆ Select All: Select all channels currently displayed.
 - ◆ **Select None**: Deselect all selected channels.
 - ◆ **Preview**: Displays (a) currently selected channel(s).
- The Favourite Channels settings have been completed.

♦ Add

You can use this function when one or more favourite channels have been selected.

1 Press the **D.MENU** button.

Result: The DTV menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Channel.

Result: The options available in the **Channe1** group are displayed.

- 3 Press the **ENTER** (→) button.
- 4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Favourite Channels.
- 5 Press the ENTER () button.
- 6 Press the red button in the Favourite Channels menu. To add more channels, refer to the step 7 above.
 - To add all channels to the favourites channel list, press the red button.
 - ◆ To remove all channels, press the green button.

- **2** Press the blue button.

Result: The selected channel and number will be deleted.

To add a deleted channel back into the favourite channel list, see "Add" on page 26.

- ◆ To configure the settings so that pressing the P ⊚ or ⊚ button after setting up your favourite channels selects a channel from among your favourite channels:
 - Press the CH.LIST button. The channel list is displayed.
 - 2 Press the yellow button. When the favourite channel list is displayed, press the blue button to finish the setting.
 - ◆ To configure the settings so that pressing the P ⊚ or ⊚ button after setting up your favourite channels selects a channel from among all channels:
 - 1 Press the **CH.LIST** button. All stored favourite channels are listed.
 - 2 Press the yellow button. When the favourite channel list is displayed, press the blue button to finish the setting.




















Setting up the Parental Lock













This feature allows you to prevent unauthorized users, such as children, from watching unsuitable programmes by a 4-digit PIN (Personal Identification Number) code that is defined by the user. The on-screen menu will instruct you to assign a PIN code (you can change it later, if necessary).

1 Press the **D.MENU** button.

Result: The DTV menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select **Preference**.

Result: The options available in the **Preference** group are displayed.

3 Press the ENTER (→) button.

4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Parental Lock.

Press the **ENTER** (→) button.

Result: The **Enter PIN** is displayed.

5 Enter your current 4-digit PIN code by using the numeric buttons (0~9).

Result: The options available in the Parental Lock group are displayed with the Parental Rating selected.

➤ The default PIN code for a new TV set is **0000**.

 If you enter a invalid PIN code, the Invalid PIN code. Please try again. message is displayed.

6 Press the **ENTER** (→) button.

7 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the age rating you want to lock out. Press the ENTER (→) button.

8 If you want to change the PIN code, select **Change PIN** by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button. Press the **ENTER** (◄) button.

Result: The Enter New PIN is displayed.

9 Enter your new PIN code by using the numeric buttons (0~9).

Result: The Confirm New PIN is displayed.

10 Re-enter your new PIN code to confirm by using the numeric buttons (0~9).

Result: The Your PIN code has been changed successfully message is displayed.

If you forget the PIN code, press the remote control buttons in the following sequence, which resets the PIN to **0-0-0-0**: **POWER** (Off), **MUTE**, **8**, **2**, **4**, **POWER** (On)

Viewing EPG (Electronic Programme Guide) Information

The EPG (Electronic Programme Guide) information is provided by the broadcasters. Programme entries may appear blank or out of date as result of the information broadcast on a given channel. The display will dynamically update as soon as new information becomes available.

♦ Now & Next Guide

For the six channels indicated in the left-hand column, displays the Current programme and the Next programme information.

♦ Full Guide

Displays the programme information as time ordered 30 minute segments. One and half hours of programme information is displayed which may be scrolled forwards or backwards in time.

- 1 Press the **D.MENU** button.
 - Result: The options available in the **Guide** group are displayed.
- 2 Press the ENTER () button.
- 3 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Now & Next Guide or Full Guide. Press the ENTER () button.

 Result: The selected guide menu is displayed.
 - You can also display the guide menu simply by pressing the GUIDE button.
- 4 To Then

Watch a programme in the EPG list

- Select a programme by pressing the ▲/▼/◄/▶ button.
- ◆ Press the ENTER (←) button.
- If the next programme is selected, it is scheduled with the clock icon displayed. If the ENTER (() button is pressed again, the scheduling is canceled with the clock icon gone. For details about scheduling programmes, refer to the next page.

View programme information

- Press the INFO () button when the programme of your choice is highlighted.





Using the Scheduled List













If you make a scheduled viewing list of programs you may like to see, the channel will be automatically switched to the scheduled program at the scheduled time even if you are watching another program.

1 Press the **D.MENU** button.

Result: The options available in the **Guide** group are displayed.

2 Press the ENTER () button.

3 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select **Scheduled List**. Press the **ENTER** (」) button.

Result: The selected guide menu is displayed.

4 Press the red button to add a new programme.

Result: The menu for adding a programme is displayed with Channel selected.

Fress the ▲ or ▼ button to select the required channel. Press the ENTER (→) button.

Result: The **Time** is selected.

The teletext pages are organized according to six categories:


Programming the Remote Control for Other Components

Your TV comes equipped with a universal remote control. In addition to controlling the TV, the universal remote control can also operate a VCR, Cable box, DVD, and Set-Top Box (even if your VCR, Cable box and DVD are made by manufacturers other than Samsung).

- The remote control might not be compatible with all VCRs, DVD players, Cable boxes, and Set-Top Boxes.
